RESPONSIBILITIES

- Read and interpret blueprints and drawings
- Calculate requirements and prepare layouts to follow building codes
- Measure, cut, shape and assemble materials
- Build foundations, house framework and concrete forms such as tunnels and bridges
- Fit and install windows, doors, flooring, walls, stairs, roof systems, mouldings and hardware
- Maintain, repair and renovate residences and wooden structures in places such as mills, mines, hospitals and industrial plants

WHAT YOU'LL NEED to become a certified carpenter

Entrance Requirements

Usually a combination of 4+ years of work experience in the trade, plus some high school, college or industry courses in carpentry to be eligible for certification.

Apprenticeship Program: 3 to 4 years, includes technical training, on-the-job training and exam. Journeyman certificate awarded after successful completion. As an apprentice, you also earn while you learn.
